## **Eligibility Criteria for SPARC Institutions**

The eligibility criteria for the Institutions to be involved in SPARC were framed initially in 2018-19 during the inception of the scheme and revised afterwards in the Standing Finance Committee (SFC) meeting held on 9th December 2021.

## (A) Eligibility criteria of Indian Institutions:

(1) Top 100 Higher Education Institutions as per the NIRF\* (National Institutional Ranking Framework, MoE) are eligible under SPARC.

(2) All Central Universities and Institutes of National Importance\* (including those having a NIRF ranking of more than 100) are eligible under SPARC.

## (B) Eligibility criteria of Overseas Institutions:

(1) Top 800 Overseas Higher Education Institutions based on the QS\* (Quacquarelli Symonds) world ranking, from as many as 28 foreign countries\* (the countries originally involved in SPARC), will be under the purview of SPARC.

## (C) Special Considerations:

As per the discussion held in the Standing Finance Committee (SFC) Meeting on 9th December 2021, to bring more Indian Institutions / Universities and Indian Investigators under the purview of SPARC the following points are suggested:

- (1) In addition to above mentioned eligibility criteria, countries and institutions may be added with the approval of competent authority in the Ministry based on research requirements in upcoming areas.
- (2) Priority may be given to the projects across the Institutes, involving high-ranking Indian Institutes in collaboration with lower-ranked Indian Institutes. This will enhance the involvement of a greater number of Indian institutions in the project proposal.
