Incentives for Film Shooting and Production Incentives to encourage film production in India

- Upto 40% incentives subject to a cap of INR 300 million (approx. US\$ 3.6 million) for Live Shoots
 - Reimbursement of 30% of Qualifying Production Expenditure (QPE) incurred in India.
 - · Additional 5% of QPE as bonus for employing 15% or more India workforce.
 - · Additional bonus of 5% of QPE for Significant Indian Content.
- * Upto 35% incentives subject to a cap of INR 300 million (approx. US\$ 3.6 million) for Animation, Visual Effects and Postproduction Projects.
 - Reimbursement of 30% of Qualifying Production Expenditure (QPE) incurred in India.
 - · Additional bonus of 5% of QPE for Significant Indian Content.

* Additional States' Incentives

- Upto INR 30 million in Delhi, INR 10 Million in Sikkim, INR 20 Million in Uttar Pradesh, INR 25 million in Karnataka, INR 15 Million in Uttarakhand.
- · Refund of taxes (GST) levied.

* All types of films and production can avail

- Feature Films/ Web Shows or Series/Animation Series, granted permission by Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and documentaries granted permission by Ministry of External Affairs.
- Postproduction or Visual Effects or Animation Projects do not require any prior permission.

Minimum Qualifying Production Expenditure

- Nil for documentaries.
- INR 10 million (approximately US\$ 84,000) for animation, postproduction services.
- · INR 30 million (approximately US\$ 360,000) for live shoot projects
- Can be combined with incentives given by individual states (wherever applicable).

* Application Process -

- · Online applications on Film Facilitation Office (FFO) website.
- · Interim approvals for provisioning.
- · Final approval and disbursal after finish of production in India.

Incentives for Co-Production Projects

For projects granted official co-production status as part of bilateral treaty

- Reimbursement of 30% of Qualifying Co-Production Expenditure (QCE) incurred in India subject to a cap of INR 300 million (approx.US\$ 3.6 million).
- * Can avail incentive from both India and treaty partner country.
- * Additional States' incentives also available.
- * India has bilateral Audio Visual Co-Production Agreements with 16 countries.

* Application Process -

- · Official Co production status from M I&B.
- · Interim approval for budget provisioning.
- Interim disbursement after commencement of production.
- Final disbursement after finish of shoot or production in India.
